FROM THE CEO

Reaching Further

THE LOVE of Christ reached further last year as you partnered with AMG to make the gospel known. God used you to produce amazing fruit and to advance His kingdom for His glory. These are just some highlights:

In West Africa, you reached more than 100,000 middle school students in public schools through our network of volunteer chaplains. Lives were changed as the students studied lessons from the Bible through the year, with many becoming followers of Christ. Even some parents came to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior!

- » In Colombia, new child and youth development centers were opened, reaching even more precious boys and girls.
- » You provided relief to flood victims in Southeast Asia, helping hundreds of families in desperate need and sharing the love of Jesus with them.
- » You helped train Iranian national leaders to impact more of their countrymen with the gospel.
- » You helped start more than 40 church planting efforts among unreached people groups where the gospel was not present in places like Pakistan, Indonesia, and Bangladesh.
- » You provided medical care to thousands more people in places like Haiti, Uganda, Guatemala, and St. Luke's Hospital, where a new radiotherapy wing opened in May.

And with your continued, faithful help, God will do even more incredible things in 2025:

- » Even more children will be reached in Uganda as the new school facilities are completed at AMG's Upendo school, offering education and

biblical teaching to more than 1,000 students. In Kenya, construction will begin on the Precious Zawadi Academy, that will eventually offer hope to 1,000 students in the Eldama Ravine area. Even more children will be reached in West Africa with the message of the gospel as the ministry in public schools continues to expand.

- » More than 50 new church planting efforts among unreached people groups will begin, bringing the message of the gospel to many more lost communities.
- » National missionary and pastor training for Iranian churches and others will expand further.
- » More Burmese refugee children will be reached in Thailand as the facilities will allow the doubling of the number of boys and girls to 200.
- » And with God's help, we will be able to reach more people with the Good News in the Muslim countries of North Africa and the Middle East.

In Acts 20:22–24, we read about Paul's single-minded commitment to proclaiming the gospel by going to Jerusalem despite fully expecting trials and suffering. May the Lord keep us just as focused on our mission of meeting people's deepest spiritual, physical, and other needs with the gospel, seeing lives and communities transformed for His glory. I am so grateful for your ongoing prayerful and faithful support that allows His kingdom to continue to advance.

Hope Rewritten

REVEREND DR. U Zaw Min, director of AMG Thailand, shared that 2024 has been a year of remarkable growth, transformation, and deep impact. Through national missionaries, child development centers, and outreach programs, God is bringing hope to the most vulnerable.

At AMG's child development centers, lives are being shaped daily. These centers provide education, spiritual discipleship, and a safe environment where children can grow in their faith. In October, during the school break, children returned home to visit their families. By November, excitement filled the centers as they prepared for Sports Day, a time of fellowship, teamwork, and encouragement.

December, the busiest month, brought the joy of Christmas to every AMG center. Children received Bundles of Love, and each center hosted Christmas worship services featuring songs, dramas, and games. Parents and villagers gathered, and many heard the Good News of Jesus for the first time. "These events do more than provide gifts," Rev. Dr. U Zaw Min shared. "They are opportunities for children and their families to experience the love of Christ."

AMG Thailand's impact extended beyond children's centers and into prison cells.

A Christmas service at Nakhon Nayok prison welcomed 300 inmates, sharing hope through worship, testimonies, and the message of redemption in Christ. Partnering with local churches and ministries, AMG Thailand reminded men and women behind bars that they are not forgotten.

One former inmate, Chuchit, knows the power of this ministry firsthand. Once feared in his community for his criminal lifestyle of violence, drugs, and addiction, Chuchit found himself in prison again and again until he encountered AMG's Bible correspondence course.

Through this program, he read the gospel for the first time. His heart began to change as AMG staff continued to disciple him through letters and visits. Chuchit was a new man in Christ by the time he was released.

“If it weren’t for AMG, I believe I would still be in jail,” he shared. “I didn’t know how to live a life free from sin. AMG introduced me to Jesus and even provided food and essentials when I had nothing.”

Now, Chuchit is not only a believer, he is a witness to others behind bars. He visits prisons, sharing his testimony with inmates and telling them, “If God can change me, He can change you.”

“We saw prisoners deeply moved by the message of salvation,” Rev. Dr. U Zaw Min said. “For many, it was the first time they heard of Christ’s forgiveness and love.”

Because of God’s grace and your generosity, AMG Thailand is reaching the lost, the forgotten, and the broken—offering hope, healing, and the love of Christ. “We thank God for His provision and for the faithful partners who stand with us,” Rev. Dr. U Zaw Min expressed.





KENYA WATER PROJECTS

A Drop of Hope

FOR ESTHER and her family, access to clean water was once unimaginable. Living in a slum in Kenya, where safe drinking water is a very rare commodity, every day was a struggle. The only available water source was the nearby river—polluted with sewage and waste, making it a breeding ground for disease.

Without clean water, illness became a part of her life. Esther's children often missed school due to waterborne diseases like cholera and typhoid, and she herself suffered from typhoid—a sickness that was not only painful but also expensive to treat. The cycle of sickness and financial strain felt never-ending.


Then, everything changed. Through AMG, Esther received a water filter—a simple yet powerful gift that transformed her daily life. For the first time, she could give her children safe water to drink without fear of illness. The impact on her family was immediate and radical. Everyone's health improved dramatically. No longer burdened by medical expenses from preventable diseases, she could focus on providing for her family.

But the impact didn't stop at her household. Esther's home became a place of hope for others in her

community. Her neighbors started coming to get clean water. Today, her filter serves at least five families—more than thirty people—offering them the same life-changing relief she has experienced.

This incredible transformation was made possible because of you. In June 2024, we asked for help, and you responded with overwhelming generosity—giving beyond our goal and blessing many families in desperate need of clean water. Your support has made an incredible impact in communities like Esther's, breaking the cycle of waterborne illness and bringing health, hope, and dignity to so many. Thank you for your compassion, generosity, and willingness to be the hands and feet of Christ. Because of you, lives are being changed, and communities are growing together—one drop of clean water at a time.

Refuge After the Storm

MANY OF the places in which AMG works are susceptible to natural disasters such as earthquakes, volcano eruptions, typhoons, and very often flooding. When devastating floods swept through South Asia, families in Myanmar and countries in the Indian subcontinent were left struggling to survive. Thousands of homes were destroyed, crops were lost, and entire communities were overwhelmed. But in the midst of this crisis, you stepped in with generosity and compassion—and because of you, hope was being restored to hundreds of families in those countries. Thanks to your support, aid reached over 830 families, providing roof tin for shelter, food, bedding, hygiene items, and land repairs.

In the Indian subcontinent, villages were underwater for days. The communities were very grateful to AMG national workers for the relief they received. People continued to struggle to find daily work due to the extent of the damage to businesses and workshops. They described it as a vicious cycle of no work, no money, no business, no work, but the help from AMG made a difference in their lives.

Beyond meeting physical needs, your generosity opened doors for AMG's national missionaries to

offer not just relief but also the message of God's love.

In Bangladesh, your impact extended even further by offering future protection to AMG's Hebron Child Development Center. A newly constructed protective wall now shields the center from dangerous soil erosion along the riverbank, ensuring that future floods won't wash away the center or destroy its storeroom. Without this wall, the next rainy season could have brought devastating loss yet again—but because of you, this refuge for vulnerable children is protected.

For children like Elizabeth, Hebron is more than just a place to learn—it is a place where lives are transformed. Elizabeth was born in a remote village with no modern communication, no school, and no access to education. As the oldest of four siblings, she had never heard the gospel and had no hope of a future beyond the struggles of daily life. But that changed when her father brought her to the Hebron Child Development Center.

Elizabeth shares, "I learned the story of creation and about God in Sunday school. It was so exciting for me to attend, and after a couple of years, I

started to attend the AWANA program too. I learned worship songs and Bible stories and memorized Bible verses. Through these classes, I slowly understood who Jesus Christ is in my life.”

After surrendering her life to Christ, Elizabeth said to us, “I confessed my sins and asked God to forgive me. I felt so much joy and peace knowing how much God loves me. I believe that Jesus is my Savior, and He is the only way to heaven.”

Last summer, Elizabeth was baptized, publicly declaring her faith in Christ. She is now dedicated to studying God’s Word every day, listening for His voice as she prepares for her future, saying, “I am always thankful to my sponsor who made it possible for me to stay here and continue my studies. Not only that, but he sends me gifts and support for my family. I cannot express how much he cares for me.” Elizabeth has now completed high school and is preparing to attend college.

Many more lives were helped in these countries in the name of Jesus. Thank you for standing with these communities in their time of desperate need.

Hope for the Persecuted

ADIL AND his family arrived at Sablone House in distress. They had fled their home in a small city near Lahore, Pakistan after a terrifying incident that nearly cost them their lives. When Adil arrived, he was experiencing severe panic attacks, dehydration, and dangerously high blood pressure due to extreme stress and heat. Our medical team immediately provided him with care, stabilizing his condition. Once he felt better, he shared his harrowing story.

Adil and his family lived in a rented home, where his young son kept hens as pets. One day, one of the hens accidentally jumped into the neighbor's yard. The neighbors, who belong to the majority religion, were upset and accused Adil's son of committing blasphemy. Within an hour, an angry mob had gathered, threatening to kill the family. Fearing for their lives, Adil and his family fled their home with only the clothes on their backs.

At Sablone House, Adil and his family received not only medical care but also emergency food assistance. He expressed deep gratitude for this support, which has allowed him the time to seek a safer home for his family. Adil's story is just one of many that illustrate the desperate need for more places of refuge and support for Christians facing persecution in Pakistan.

There is an urgent need to expand this work, and following the tremendous impact of Sablone House, the Lord is leading us to launch a new center in Lahore. This center will share the love of Jesus and provide essential services such as:

PRIMARY EDUCATION: Offering quality education from grades 1 to 5 in its first year, expanding to Grade 8 over the next three years. Many children from Christian families are denied access to quality education, and this school will

give them the tools and opportunity to break the cycle of poverty their families have experienced.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING: Teaching practical skills such as sewing for women and computer literacy to young people, equipping them to secure better-paying jobs, become self-sustaining, and not be at risk of experiencing modern-day slavery.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE: Providing food, shelter, and legal aid for those who have been forced to flee due to religious persecution or modern-day slavery.

Pakistan is ranked as the fifth worst country in the world for Christians, where systemic discrimination forces believers into low-paying, dangerous jobs. Many are trapped in bonded labor at brick kilns, unable to escape generations of debt. The literacy rate among Christians is only 34%, far below the national average, further limiting their opportunities for advancement. The new center will help to address these problems.

Because of your generous support in 2024, the construction of this new center is underway and will equip Christian families with the tools they need to break free from oppression. Women who complete the sewing program will have access to jobs with partner boutiques. Young people trained in computer skills will gain employment in digital fields, opening doors to a brighter future.

The impact of this project cannot be overstated. Your continued support can provide Christian families in Pakistan with hope, dignity, and a future free from fear, proclaiming the love of Christ in word and deed.

PALM CHILDREN'S HOME

More than Shelter in Thailand

WHEN MYANMAR'S military coup erupted in 2021, chaos reigned across the country. Entire villages were burned, families were torn apart, and children were left to fend for themselves. Desperate for safety, many fled across the Thai border, only to find themselves in overcrowded camps, vulnerable to trafficking and exploitation.

AMG's national missionaries saw the suffering firsthand and knew they had to act, and with your help, they did. In the midst of this crisis, you stepped in to come alongside those who were hurting and the nationals who were trying to help them.

In May 2022, your help made it possible to open the Light ASEAN Hostel, providing a refuge where children who had lost everything could finally find safety, education, and the love of Christ. And what began as a temporary shelter for fifty children quickly became a long-term lifeline. Ester and three other leaders stepped in to provide care, creating not just a shelter but a home.

Last year, we shared with you the urgent need to expand the hostel due to the overwhelming number of children seeking refuge. You responded

with incredible generosity, and because of your support, construction has begun on a new, larger facility that will allow our nationals

to care for 200 children, twice the number we can presently help! To mark this new chapter, the staff have renamed the hostel "Palm Children's Home"—a symbol of new beginnings and hope.

Among the children now safe at Palm Children's Home is Aung Min Khant, a young boy who fled his war-torn home with nothing. Today, because of your generosity, his life looks completely different.

We asked how his life has been transformed by the love of Jesus since arriving, and he said, "I can eat good food because of your support. I was a war refugee and did not have a proper house. Now, I live in a real home that is safe. I have friends here. My best friend is Eh Do Htoo. We play together every day. I used to fight, but the teachers told me that was not good, and I no longer fight. I have come to know God. I have confessed my sins, and I know He has forgiven me.

Aung Min is just one of many children whose lives have been completely transformed at Palm Children’s Home.

When they first arrive, they are usually malnourished, afraid, and uncertain about their future. At Palm Children’s Home, they are nourished, educated, loved, and most importantly, shown the love of Christ. They are learning about a God who will never leave them, a God who is restoring what was taken from them. Since opening, Palm Children’s Home has provided food and shelter and introduced the children there to Jesus Christ. They are growing in their faith and carrying the hope of the gospel into their future.

The need to complete the expansion of Palm Children’s Home is greater than ever. With continued unrest in Myanmar, more children arrive every day seeking refuge. Thanks to your faithfulness, the expansion will allow us to welcome double the number of children there, giving them a home, an education, and a faith that will sustain them.





INDONESIA

Furthering the Gospel

THE STORIES of our national missionaries around the world are often powerful examples of how God led them to a saving knowledge of Him and then used them to reach others of their countrymen with the gospel. Being familiar with the language and the culture, the Lord has been using so many of them to produce plentiful fruit.

As a young boy in Indonesia, Timotius wrestled with questions about truth. Was it found in Islam, the faith he was born into, or in Christianity? His search led him to a small book comparing Jesus in the Bible and the Quran. God used that book to reveal the truth to Timotius. Jesus is the way. Timotius sought out a church and later shared with our national leadership in Indonesia, “During my first Sunday service, I felt God’s presence as the congregation worshiped. That day, I accepted Jesus as my Lord.” He immersed himself in Bible study and worship and was baptized.

Transformed by the Good News, Timotius felt compelled to share Christ with others. When he learned that AMG International was praying and looking for evangelists to go into unreached people groups (places with no or extremely few Christians), he knew it was God’s call. His heart was burdened for his people, who remained bound by spiritual darkness. Timotius said, “I knew God was calling me to share the hope of the gospel with my people.”

Timotius’ mission is to disciple, equip, and plant house churches among unreached tribes. While many are open to the gospel, deep-rooted ancestral religious practices hold them back because it is all they have known for generations.

Not only was Timotius’ life transformed, but now he is sharing the gospel and transforming

communities through the gospel. One day, a security guard at a local bank visited Timotius’ barbershop for a haircut and therapeutic massage. The man wanted a head, shoulder, and arm massage because he suffers from severe monthly headaches and nosebleeds, requiring medication. But after his visit, something changed. He did not get any headaches or nosebleeds. When the man came back, he said God cured him. Timotius asked if he could pray for him in the name of Jesus, and the man immediately agreed. Now a regular visitor, he continues to experience healing, and Timotius prays for him to fully embrace the gospel.

Timotius says, “Because you support church planters, lives are being transformed, people are experiencing healing, and the gospel is reaching the unreached. Please continue to pray for us, that our work will multiply, and many will come to know Jesus.”

Your prayers and generosity equip national missionaries like Timotius to bring the gospel further, to areas that have never heard the gospel. Hundreds of churches have been planted through them over the years, and this year, the church planting ministry among unreached people groups is expanding to fifty new communities with your help. Thank you for advancing the gospel in Indonesia and beyond.

Healing in Haiti

HAITI IS in crisis. Gang violence, kidnappings, and skyrocketing costs have made daily life a struggle for survival. Basic supplies are scarce. Healthcare, in particular, has become nearly impossible to access for so many. Many families cannot afford transportation to a clinic, and without care, preventable illnesses and injuries turn deadly. That's why AMG's medical clinics are more needed than ever. Because of your generosity, these clinics provide a lifeline of hope and care to those with nowhere else to turn.

Several months ago, we shared with you a need. Our clinics in Haiti lacked X-ray machines, forcing patients needing help to travel miles for diagnostics. You responded immediately, exceeding our goal and making it possible to purchase X-ray machines and critical medical supplies.

Since January 2024, AMG's clinics in Haiti have treated over 500 patients despite the country's instability. AMG's dedicated staff serve daily, ensuring no one is turned away, meeting people's medical needs while sharing with them the hope that is found in Jesus Christ.

For Rosalbert, one of the patients treated at AMG's clinic, the care he received made a lasting impact. He said, "I would rate

the quality of care I received at 95%. The doctors and nurses were attentive, professional, and truly cared for me. From the moment I entered, I was greeted with a warm smile. The nurses were kind and reassuring, and the doctor listened carefully to my concerns. The facilities were clean, well-organized, and made me feel at ease. I am so thankful for the treatment I received today."

For patients like Rosalbert, AMG's clinics provide more than just medical treatment—they offer compassion, dignity, and hope.

At AMG's clinics, patients don't just receive medical attention—they hear the hope of the gospel. Each morning, staff lead devotions, praying with and sharing Christ's love with those in need. Many come seeking medical help but leave with something even greater—a relationship with Jesus.

With your faithful giving, brand-new microphones, modern sound equipment, and a state-of-the-art editing monitor have transformed our national missionary's ability to produce clear, engaging, and impactful content. These upgrades are more than just technical improvements. They are tools that allow the message of Christ to further their reach to thousands across the Middle East and other countries around the globe.

Every day, lives are touched through Bible exposition, gospel narratives, and messages of hope. Agape Radio's impact has grown tremendously, with an audience of over 920,000 people on Facebook, 60,000 subscribers on the website, and over 3,000 podcast listeners in countries and regions such as Syria, Palestine, Algeria, Turkey, South Sudan, and beyond.

But these numbers tell only part of the story. The true impact is found in the hearts of those encountering Jesus for the first time—people like *Omar, *Karim, and *Yousef, whose lives have been forever changed.

Omar studied the Bible with Middle East Agape Radio and shared how this has impacted his life. Omar said, "Experiencing the love of the Lord, Jesus Christ, changes a person's heart and gives me hope."

Another listener, Karim, has embraced a new life in Christ through the radio's Bible messages.

"I have asked the Lord to be the King of my heart. Now, I am committed to living according to His commandments. I will pray for my family, my city, and even strangers the Lord places on my heart. My relationship with God will be my highest priority."

"I have now decided to glorify the Lord in every choice I make and in everything I do, and not to seek my glory. I have decided to have a relationship with the Lord, and I have decided to love Him more than anything else in my life because life with the Lord is true happiness," says Yousef, another listener whose life has been transformed through Agape Radio.

This partnership is helping us develop more effective ways to disciple and mentor the next generation.

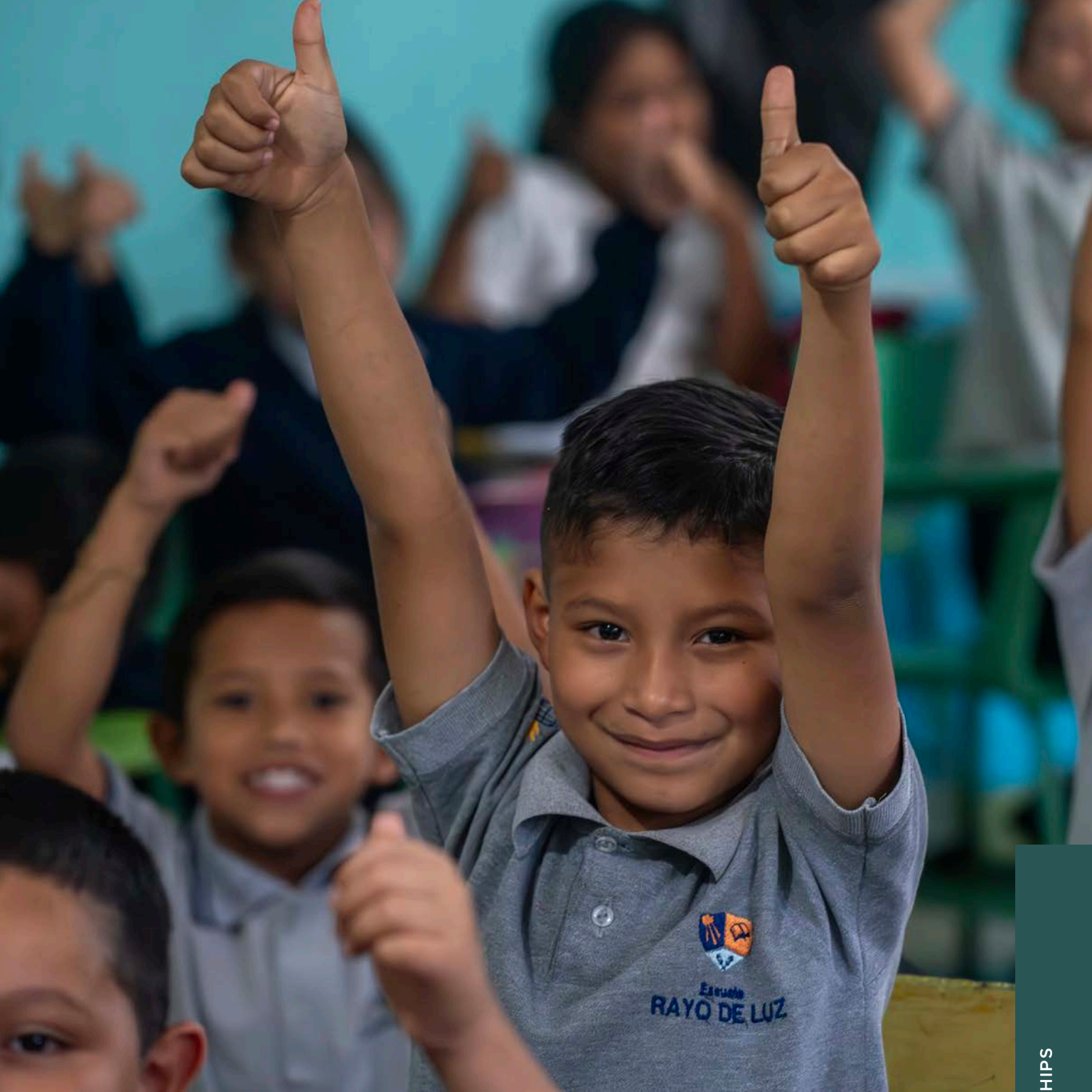
Beyond Latin America, we traveled with long-time partners Word & Deed Netherlands to visit the Philippines and witness some remarkable and innovative projects firsthand. One such initiative is a fiber project that has transformed the lives of nearly 600 farmers by helping them cultivate a

valuable fiber crop used internationally for currency production and high-strength rope products. More importantly, local churches have come alongside this effort, ensuring that each farming family hears a clear presentation of the gospel. Many farmers and their families have responded, joining their local churches and experiencing the eternal hope found in Christ.

In West Africa, we reached over 100,000 junior high-aged students in five different countries, within public schools, with weekly Bible Club meetings. We led them to Jesus and encouraged them to join local churches with their families. This highly successful partnership is impacting many lives and helping to grow the church!

At AMG, our mission remains firmly gospel centered. We continue to seek innovative and sustainable ways to address the deepest needs of children and families while pointing them to the only true hope—Jesus Christ. As we look ahead, we are excited to expand these strategic partnerships and cost-effective models to reach even more people with the transforming power of the gospel.

Thankful God Still Has a Plan for Me

OVER 20 years ago, I heard AMG's radio program say, "If you can push a broom or hug a child, you can serve in missions." God was already working in my heart, and I knew I had to go. My husband, my greatest supporter, simply said, "If God is calling you, then you better go."

At 52, I took my first mission trip to Peru, and this past December, I returned for the 8th time, celebrating Bundles of Love with the boys and girls in the AMG child development centers. That first trip, twenty years ago, led us to sponsor our first child—an experience that not only transformed their life but ours as well.

Seeing the gratitude of these children, meeting them in person, and sharing hugs and smiles is a joy beyond words. The greatest blessing? Being a part of one of our sponsored boys accepting Christ.

Over the course of several short-term mission trips, I've seen children grow into teachers, pastors, medical professionals, and even a CPA. School is a privilege for them, and they cherish the opportunity.

God has blessed me with over twenty mission trips to four countries. Some were challenging—

physically and emotionally—but each one was special. In Uganda, I broke my ankle and was

cared for like family by AMG's national missionaries. I've seen lives transformed—Solomy, once unable to walk and scooting around as a young girl, is now a grown young lady and walks with a crutch; a man in India's leprosy village hugged me, grateful for a simple touch. Angeles has been diagnosed with muscular dystrophy and will never walk, but she is always smiling and bringing joy to everyone around her.

I go to serve, love, and encourage—not to change them, but to share Jesus. I've prayed with women in prison, rejoiced with children in school, and witnessed faith in action in the most challenging places.

Mission trips will change you forever.

I could never thank God enough for allowing me to be part of this journey. All glory to Him.
