

Transforming Communities Through Gospel-Centered Child Development



IN COLOMBIA, MANY CHILDREN grow up surrounded by violent conflict, poverty, and instability. Decades of violence, displacement, and social challenges have devastated many communities and families. Amid these challenges, God is raising up faithful servants who are bringing hope to the next generation.

AMG Colombia national leaders in partnership with local churches are equipping children with something that can radically change their lives and bring hope for their future—a strong foundation in Christ. AMG's child and youth development centers provide safe spaces where children experience the love of Christ, receive nutritious food, academic support, mentorship, and biblical teaching, and build relationships with believers who care deeply about their future.

In 2025, God used faithful donors like you to open the doors of two new child and youth development centers in Colombia. The centers are transforming not only children, but also their families and entire communities.

Mariana and her younger siblings are one example. The three precious children grew up in a home shattered by drug addiction and instability. When their mother abandoned them, nine-year-old Mariana was left caring for her younger brother and sister. Concerned for their safety, the AMG center's team worked with local authorities to ensure the children were protected while their mother entered a recovery program.

During those difficult months, the team and the children began praying together regularly. Mariana learned to seek God in the middle of uncertainty, and her grandmother became more involved in the children's lives and began attending church.

Today, the family's story looks very different. Their mother has completed her recovery process and is now back home caring for her children, bringing them to the center and participating in parent meetings. What began as a moment where it seemed as if all hope was lost has become a testimony of restoration—evidence of how God works

through faithful local believers to make His love felt and advance the gospel.

Stories like this are unfolding across Colombia as AMG national leaders faithfully invest in children and families. Several centers have already contributed significantly to growing local churches, with more than 100 people now participating in discipleship groups and church gatherings.

By equipping national leaders to disciple the next generation through AMG, you are making it possible for precious boys and girls to **discover Christ, strengthen families, and **build communities of faith** that will continue sharing the gospel and the love of Jesus for years to come.**



When God Equips a Servant

AUATH NEVER EXPECTED THAT a single page of paper would radically change the course of his life.

As a ninth-grade student in Bangladesh, Auath spent much of his time helping his father with the family business. Among his responsibilities was handling stacks of paper his father purchased for work. One day, while sorting through the pages, something unusual caught his attention. It was a torn page from a book he had never seen before.

On it were the words: *“I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.”*

At the time, Auath was a Hindu and had never heard of the Bible. Yet the words stirred something deep within him. He began researching, and that led him to ask questions that he had never asked before: *Who is the way, the truth, and the life? Who is Jesus? Where can I find Him? How can I become a Christian?*

His search eventually led him to visit a church. Someone there encouraged him to visit a nearby village where believers gathered. Not long afterward, Auath met a Christian man whose parents had recently become

followers of Christ. Curious, Auath asked him how it had happened.

The man told him about attending a church service where a guest speaker was preaching. Intrigued, Auath decided to go and listen for himself. That day, as he heard the message of the gospel, the Spirit of God worked in His heart and Auath chose to follow Christ and was later baptized.

But his new faith came with a cost. His family separated from him because of his decision. Even so, Auath remained committed to a life following Jesus.

God soon opened another door for him to serve. A missionary began training him to teach tailoring skills to women in his community. Through these classes, Auath was able not only to help women learn a practical trade but also to share the Good News of Jesus with them.

Over time, his ministry continued to grow. In 1993, Auath became a pastor and, together with several other believers, helped start an AMG ministry center. The early years were not easy. There were many challenges and opposition from those who wanted the center to close. But the believers prayed and trusted God.

Bangladesh was facing deep poverty at the time, and the AMG center became a place of hope. Through the center, families received help, children were cared for, and many people heard the gospel for the first time.

Today, the center is still active, still helping individuals and families experience radical change that only the gospel can bring. Please pray for Auath and his wife, and for the many AMG national missionaries proclaiming the Good News in hard places around the world.

In recent years, Auath has faced serious health challenges, including two strokes. At one point, many believed he would not recover. But by God’s grace, he continues to serve. Auath believes the Lord has kept him alive for a purpose.

Now, he and his wife faithfully teach and serve at the AMG center together.

“My hope,” Auath shares, “is to spend the rest of my life serving the Lord and spreading the Good News through AMG.”

He is deeply grateful for those who support this work and reminds others that their kindness reflects Christ’s love.

Water Changes Everything

ACCESS TO WATER IS a major challenge in many parts of the world. Very harsh climates contribute to this problem. In South Asia, when temperatures climb above 104°F, rivers shrink, and reservoirs dry up. In remote communities that lack basic infrastructure, families wake each morning wondering how they will find enough water for the day ahead.

For Lakshmi, water shaped every exhausting part of her day. Her husband was seriously injured in a workplace accident. A fall left his leg fractured, and he has been unable to return to work. The heavy responsibility of supporting the family fell on Lakshmi. Each day, she goes to work as a daily wage laborer. The work is physically demanding, but it is necessary to provide for her family. And if that were not enough, the lack of water made everything much harder.

Desperate community representatives approached AMG national leaders and explained their situation. Staff visited, surveyed the area, and confirmed the urgent need. The solution was to dig a borewell. Clean, life-saving water began to flow. The families in the community were grateful.

Today, Lakshmi no longer walks and waits for water. Her family has reliable access

nearby. She can go to work on time. “We are very happy,” she said with gratitude. “We thank AMG and the donors for providing this borewell.”

And this situation is not unique, but it is repeated in other places around the world. In Kenya, there is a village called *Maji Mazuri*—a name that means “clean water.” Yet during the rainy season, the local stream thickens and turns very muddy. Families drink what they can find, even when it makes them sick. Waterborne diseases are a huge problem.

But, because of you, AMG national missionaries have been able to provide a solution in the form of water filters. This year, 300 families in Maji Mazuri received water filters. Across the county, more than 1,000 filters have been distributed in places where piped water is still only a distant hope.

Now mothers filter water before handing it to their children. Fewer families suffer from waterborne illnesses. Something as simple as a filter has dramatically improved their daily life.

In one of the communities that AMG serves in Uganda, the need for water became even more urgent. AMG leaders serving children in this community noticed a heartbreaking

trend: high pregnancy rates among young girls. As they listened and learned, the cause became painfully clear.

Girls were walking several miles each day to collect water. During the trip and at the water sources, they were vulnerable. Some were exploited, and the walk for water had become a place of danger.

Everything changed when land was donated for a well. Now, water flows safely within the community. Up to 1,500 people benefit from it each day. Girls no longer make the dangerous journey. Families have peace of mind.

Because of you, water is flowing where it once was scarce.

Because of you, children are healthier.

Because of you, girls are safer.

Because of you, communities know they are seen and loved.

Because of you, the gospel is being shared.

Equipped to Restore Lives

IN MARCH OF 2025, the earth shook violently across parts of Myanmar and Thailand. The tremors impacted small rural communities already devastated by the civil war that has been ongoing since 2021, where the infrastructure is already broken or fragile, and the resources are limited.

In Bo Tate Village in Myanmar, home to just 22 families, the earthquake destroyed something essential to everyday life—the village’s only well. In an instant, their sole source of water for drinking, cooking, and bathing was rendered unusable. What had sustained life now stood cracked and dry. Without clean water, fear quickly set in. There was no backup system, no nearby alternative, no immediate solution.

When the village reached out for help, the AMG Thailand team responded immediately. They traveled to Bo Tate to assess the damage. Because of faithful donors like you, there was no delay. Compassion turned into action.

What happened next became a testimony of resilience and partnership shaped by the love of Jesus. Within three weeks—by God’s

grace and through your generosity—the village had water again.

Rather than waiting helplessly, the families of Bo Tate came together. Men and women labored side by side to dig a brand-new well. AMG provided the essential construction materials: cement, blocks, wooden beams, and iron sheets. The villagers, determined and unified, provided the labor.

The sound of shovels striking earth became a rhythm of hope. Children who had watched anxiously now saw water flow again. Families could cook and bathe after long days of work. Life resumed—not because disaster didn’t strike, but because love responded.

Across the earthquake-affected region, many villages like Bo Tate fell into what relief workers call the “aid gap”—places too remote, too small, or too overlooked to receive immediate assistance. But, with your help, AMG’s national missionaries can quickly respond in areas like this. They inquired carefully about each community’s most urgent needs before delivering aid.

They asked, assessed, and, with the resources you provided, responded accordingly.

Because of your support, aid reached 3,396 families and 7 churches across the region. Entire communities were stabilized because you chose to give.

In moments of deep crisis, compassion deeply impacted the lives of those in great need. The love of Christ was demonstrated not only through words, but through clean water, shelter, light, medicine, and restored dignity.

And by helping these people in crisis, you also helped advance the gospel in a spiritually dark place. The Mandalay area is a place where Buddhism is the predominant faith. It is one of Myanmar’s most culturally significant regions—known for its monasteries, temples, and spiritual heritage. But through ministries like this one, the Christian presence continues to grow, often among rural and marginalized communities.

Thank you for standing with families in Myanmar and Thailand in their moment of great need. God used you to make a difference, bringing glory to His name through His people.

Where the Gospel is Still New

PUTRA* GREW UP IN Indonesia, the country with the largest Muslim population in the world. Members of his large family belonged to the Christian minority, but for many years, faith for Putra was simply a tradition.

“As a child and even into adulthood, I profess to be a follower of Jesus because my family did,” Putra recalls. “But I had not yet experienced new life in Him.”

After graduating from high school in 1993, Putra planned to begin working. Instead, God redirected his path. He spent time at a Christian foundation, where he began to understand the gospel more deeply. It was there that his life truly changed.

During that season, Putra made a decisive commitment to follow Christ. Through prayer and discipleship, he experienced spiritual freedom and surrendered practices from his past, growing in his faith. Soon after, he enrolled at AMG’s Berita Hidup Seminary, where his faith continued to grow.

Looking back, Putra sees how God transformed his life. “I was a young man who felt broken and without a future,” he says. “But God turned my life around and gave me hope as I started serving Him.”

While studying at the seminary, Putra became aware of AMG International’s efforts to spread the gospel among the many islands of Indonesia. Years later, a former classmate contacted him with an opportunity to help reach one of Indonesia’s unreached groups, as an AMG church planter. Putra sensed God’s call and stepped into ministry.

Today, Putra and his family serve in this unreached region with one clear purpose: to make the name of Jesus known so that people may experience salvation and eternal life. The work is not easy. Local cultural differences, language barriers, and strong religious traditions make sharing the gospel difficult. Yet Putra continues faithfully, relying on prayer and the leading of the Holy Spirit.

“We face many challenges,” Putra explains. “But we trust God to work in people’s hearts.”

And He is. Putra has seen God answer prayers for people facing illness, hardship, and spiritual struggles. When people experience God’s power through prayer, their hearts often open to hear the message of Christ.

“We see God move in powerful ways,” Putra says. “People experience healing, relief, and freedom in the name of Jesus.”

Putra’s vision is to see the gospel spread across the Madurese community through disciples who make disciples. He hopes to see Bible study groups multiplying in homes and communities across the region.

None of this ministry happens without help. Putra and his family are deeply grateful for the partners who make this work possible.

“My family and I thank you for your support, prayers, and care,” Putra says. “You are part of what God is doing here.”

Because of faithful partners like you, national missionaries like Putra can proclaim the gospel among people who have never heard the name of Jesus. As Scripture reminds us: “Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous deeds among all peoples.” — Psalm 96:3

And through your partnership, that declaration is reaching the Madurese people and many other communities in Indonesia and other countries in Southeast Asia.

Equipped to Reach the Next Generation

ACROSS AFRICA, JUNIOR HIGH students are perhaps in the most formative stage of their lives. As they transition into adolescence, their identity, values, and beliefs are shaped by what they learn and the people around them. During this very formative stage, so many of them face challenges such as poverty, family instability, peer pressure, and limited access to consistent spiritual guidance.

AMG International's national missionaries are meeting this need by establishing Bible Clubs in public schools and equipping volunteer chaplains to bring the gospel directly to students. Each week, boys and girls ages 12–15 gather for Bible teaching, prayer, mentorship, and discussion in a safe and engaging environment. Students receive structured, biblical study materials, Bibles, and encouragement to connect with local churches, helping them grow in their faith and share Christ with others.

The opportunity is vast. Across Ghana, Togo, Benin, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Liberia, and Kenya, countries where nearly 50% of the population is under the age of 15, there are

nearly 44,000 junior high schools. Young people, who face pressures such as child labor, early marriage, economic hardship, and cultural beliefs that leave them without a clear understanding of the gospel, have the opportunity to learn about Jesus, the One who can bring hope for the rest of their lives and eternity.

God is opening remarkable doors. In 2025 alone, approximately 143,000 students in these countries were reached through AMG Bible Clubs, and this ministry continues to expand rapidly.

AMG national missionaries have most recently begun expanding Bible Clubs into Kenya, and the program is now in six schools, reaching 1,500 students each week. In just one school term, 200 of these students professed their decision to follow Christ and now continue in discipleship through the weekly program.

The impact goes beyond individual students' lives and affects the schools and homes these students come from. Teachers and parents are already seeing the difference. One teacher shared how a previously

disruptive student began to change after attending Bible Club regularly. Through God's Word and the mentorship of trained chaplains, his behavior and outlook transformed.

As the reputation of the impact of the Bible Clubs grows, more and more schools are requesting this ministry program. With faithful partners, AMG is equipping the next generation with God's Word—raising young people who will shine the light of Christ in their schools, homes, and communities.

Please pray for this amazing opportunity to impact a new generation in Africa with the gospel and see them become the future leaders of their churches and communities.

Equipped to Heal

ANDREA, A 52-YEAR-OLD HOMEMAKER

in Guatemala, experienced a frightening accident. A fall left her in severe pain, and she was rushed to the emergency department at Señorita Elena Hospital.

There, a doctor quickly examined Andrea and ordered an X-ray. The results revealed a serious injury—a distal fracture of the tibia and fibula in her right leg near the ankle. Surgery would be necessary.

Andrea trusted the AMG medical staff with her care, and a skilled surgical team performed the operation. By God's grace, the surgery went well. Andrea spent the next two days in the hospital receiving loving care as nurses and doctors monitored her recovery and treated her surgical wound. But healing would take time.

In the weeks that followed, Andrea returned for regular follow-up visits and additional X-rays. Doctors discovered that the fracture was healing slowly because of its difficult location near the ankle joint. To support her recovery, she was referred to a rehabilitation specialist who worked with her for a month before she continued treatment through outpatient care.

Throughout this long process, Andrea experienced loving care in the name of Jesus. Physically, she relied on a wheelchair, immobilizers, and crutches. Daily life became challenging, and adapting to these limitations was not easy. Yet she remained committed to following every instruction from her medical team with faith that God would provide the healing she needed.

With faith in God, perseverance, rehabilitation, and the dedicated care she received, Andrea gradually regained strength. After months of therapy and exercises, her recovery was complete. Today, Andrea can walk again without complications.

"I am deeply grateful to God and to the doctor who treated me with patience, dedication, and professionalism," Andrea shared. "I am thankful for every member of the staff who cared for me during this time."

Because of faithful supporters like you, hospitals like Señorita Elena are equipped with trained medical professionals, essential equipment, and compassionate care to serve those in need.

Andrea's healing is one story among many—an example that when medical ministries are equipped, lives are restored. Each year, tens of thousands of patients experience medical care with the love of Jesus. Pray that these lives are transformed and that they find spiritual healing alongside physical healing.

Partnerships that Multiply Impact

AMG INTERNATIONAL CONTINUES TO

expand its global impact through strategic partnerships that strengthen communities, develop leaders, and bring the hope of Jesus Christ to those in need. At AMG, every initiative is intentionally gospel-centered, seeking not only to meet physical needs but also to share Christ's transforming message.

Lasting transformation rarely happens in isolation. The most effective impact occurs when churches, ministries, institutions, and community leaders unite around a shared vision to serve others and advance Christ's mission. Through these collaborations, AMG has been able to extend its reach, strengthen programs, and create new opportunities for growth in communities around the world.

One growing collaboration is with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), where sports provide a powerful platform for discipleship, mentorship, and leadership development among young people. Through camps, sports initiatives, and leadership training opportunities, this partnership helps young people develop discipline, teamwork, and character rooted in biblical values. These programs create environments where youth are spiritually and relationally encouraged by mentors who invest in their lives and point them to Christ.

AMG also partners with organizations working to strengthen community-based protection systems and promote justice. Collaboration with International Justice Mission (IJM) has helped equip churches, educators, and community leaders to recognize and respond to the needs of vulnerable children and families. Through dialogue forums, workshops, and leadership training, communities are developing stronger networks that promote protection, prevent violence, and support restoration. These efforts reflect a biblical conviction to defend the vulnerable and uphold the dignity of every person created in God's image.

Strategic partnerships have also expanded AMG's outreach to young people through school-based Bible clubs. In West Africa, more than 143,000 junior high students across six countries now participate in weekly clubs held within public schools. These gatherings create opportunities for students to hear the gospel, grow spiritually, and connect with local churches.

Building on this success, a pilot program has begun in Kenya, introducing Bible Clubs in six public schools and demonstrating strong potential for future expansion.

Partnerships have also strengthened educational leadership and professional

development for teachers. Through collaboration with academic and leadership organizations and international partnerships, more than 130,000 teachers have been equipped with practical tools that improve teaching practices and strengthen leadership within schools.

In northeastern Uganda, a partnership with Word & Deed Netherlands has introduced a family-centered sponsorship model that equips parents to pursue economic stability, education, and spiritual growth while remaining connected to the local church.

These partnerships reflect AMG's conviction that transformation multiplies when ministry is collaborative and rooted in the gospel. Together with churches, ministries, and community leaders, AMG continues working toward communities where children are protected, families are strengthened, leaders are equipped, and the hope of Christ is shared with the next generation.

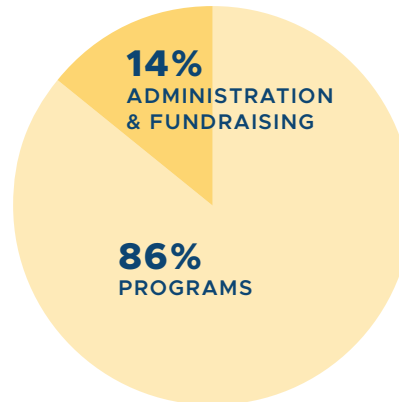

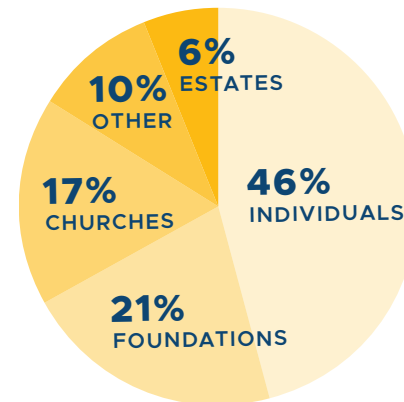
